Camp on Wheels (COWS) is a 501 (c)3 non-profit organization. COWS is a fundamental, Bible-believing, camp ministry. It is a mission effort dedicated to serving local churches that are (1) geographically or (2) culturally isolated from the traditional camp setting. Using the tools of a Bible preaching platform and trained counselors in the cabin, COWS' goal is to teach the lost the message of Christ and to strengthen Christian young people through practical interaction. Directions

From Interstate 40 take Hwy 191 south to Springerville. Go past Springerville and continue 24 miles to Alpine. Stay on Hwy 191 for a 1/4 mile past the intersection with Hwy 180, then turn right on the first dirt road. Follow the road 1 mile to Camp on Wheels.

From Phoenix take Hwy 60 East. Follow Hwy 60 and turn south on Hwy 191 to Springerville. Go past Springerville and continue 24 miles to Alpine. Stay on Hwy 191 for a 1/4 mile past the intersection with Hwy 180, then turn right on the first dirt road. Follow the road 1 mile to Camp on Wheels.

From Albuquerque take Interstate 25 south to Socorro. Take Hwy 60 west to Springerville. Turn south on Hwy 191 and continue 24 miles to Alpine. Stay on Hwy 191 for a 1/4 mile past the intersection with Hwy 180, then turn right on the first dirt road. Follow the road 1 mile to Camp on Wheels.

General Information

What to bring: Bible, bedding, pillow, towels, toiletries, camera, flashlight, spending money (for the Snack Shop, General Store, and Craft Shop), jacket, sports clothes for activities, and nice casual clothes for informal services.

Do not bring: Alcoholic beverages, drugs, tobacco, fireworks, ammunition, guns, weapons, CD, tape players, MP3 players, cell phones, pagers, two-way communication devices, computers, radios, TVs, video games, scooters, skateboards, rollerblades, magazines, or apparel with inappropriate graphics or lettering.

Christian conduct: As a Christian organization, COWS maintains high standards of conduct. Campers who use tobacco, alcohol, or any form of illegal drugs will be discharged. No physical contact of a romantic nature is allowed. Any non-cooperative or non-compliant campers will be subject to dismissal.

Ladies/girls' note: Skirts are required for the evening services (slits must not come above the knee). All attire must come at least to the top of the knee and cover the shoulders. Low necklines (front or back) are not acceptable attire. Tops must be long enough to not bare midribs during activities. Loose-fitting pants, jeans, or knee-length fashions may be worn except when otherwise specified.

Men/boys' note: Long pants and shirts with collars are required for the evening services. Fashions to the knee may be worn for activity times.

COWS reserves the right to ask anyone to change his or her outfit, if in the estimation of the staff, it does not comply with these standards.

A Registered Nurse will be on duty at all times. Special instructions will be given at camp for those taking medications. For the protection of all campers, we are unable to retain campers with contagious conditions such as chickenpox or lice.

All Meals are included in the price of the camping program. Campers with special diets must bring their own necessary supplements.

Phones cannot be accessed by campers **except for emergencies.**

Campers will stay the entire camp period except for sickness or an emergency at home.
